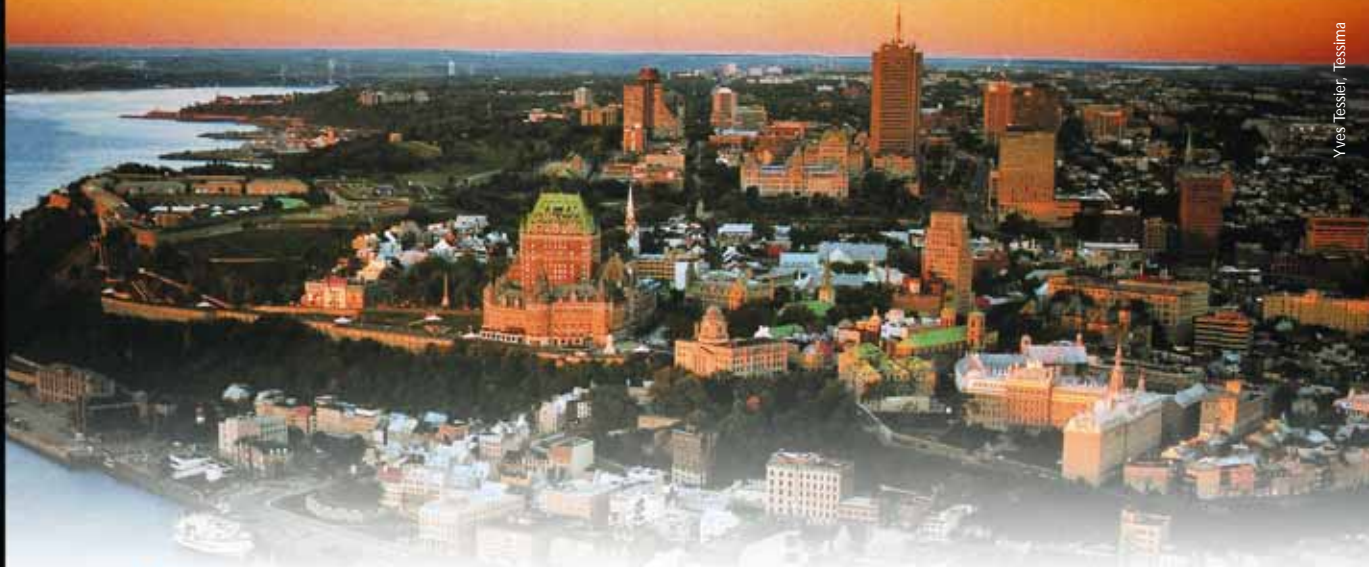

One of the great voices of contemporary literature and a remarkable Renaissance woman, Dr. Maya Angelou will deliver the keynote address at the Opening Plenary. Poet, educator, historian, best-selling author, actress, playwright, civil-rights activist, producer and director, she travels the world making appearances and spreading her legendary wisdom. Renowned for her script writing and directing in the film industry, she has also made hundreds of television appearances.

Her best-selling autobiographical account of her youth, *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings*, won critical acclaim in 1970 and was a two-hour TV special. Recipient of numerous honorary degrees, Dr. Angelou is sure to inspire with her views on themes of justice and human rights.



CHANTAL HÉBERT

As the National Affairs writer for the *Toronto Star*, Chantal Hébert is an influential and compelling voice on major national issues of the day. But what makes her perspective unique is that she has experienced the reality of Canada's French-English duality. In 1966, while still a youngster, and speaking only French, she moved to Toronto with her family. This firsthand knowledge of the realities of living in a country with two official languages, and all of the attendant challenges and issues that come along with that, informs her perspective on political events.

In addition to her role at the *Star*, Hébert is also a columnist for *Le Devoir* in Montreal, and weekly participant on the political panel on CBC's *The National*.



THE RT. HON. JEAN CHRÉTIEN, P.C., Q.C.

A passionate Canadian with sharp political instincts, Jean Chrétien led three consecutive Liberal majority governments as the country's twentieth prime minister. First elected to Parliament in 1963 at the age of 29, Jean Chrétien served with six prime ministers, held 12 ministerial positions and served in Parliament for a total of 27 years. Besides presiding over a period of sustained economic growth, Jean Chrétien's years as PM saw Canada through a series of pivotal moments in its history, from the Quebec referendum and the Clarity Act to his famous Team Canada trade missions and firm stance on the Iraq war.

With his unique story-telling ability, Jean Chrétien will treat attendees to a candid reflection on his years as Prime Minister. His vitality, charm and love for his country cross political lines and make him one of Canada's most sought-after public speakers.



PHIL FONTAINE

*BREAKFAST
TUESDAY, AUGUST 19*

Phil Fontaine, National Chief of the Assembly of First Nations, has been a powerful force in native politics since the 1970s, having orchestrated several key deals designed to improve the quality of life for Indigenous people. At once soft-spoken and tenacious, he will share his insight on successfully effecting change with governments.

Since first being elected National Chief in 1997, Phil Fontaine has been a leader in the advancement of First Nations issues, urging governments to ease Aboriginal poverty and to work harder to settle more than 1,100 outstanding land claims. National Chief Fontaine has been a unifying force among First Nations and has brought the message of Indigenous peoples to the international stage.

Monday, August 18, 9:00 - 10:30 a.m.

1.1 Media in the Courtroom: Access to the Court File

Judges are facing more frequent media requests for copies of exhibits from proceedings. These can include written or videotaped statements to police, “Mr. Big” videos, crime scene photos, psychological reports or affidavits in high profile family law cases, to name just a few. How do you weigh the media’s demand for increased access against a defendant’s right to a fair trial? A journalist, a lawyer and a professor will discuss various requests, their impact and the current state of the law.

1.2 A Practitioner’s Guide to the Recruitment Cycle: The Legal Considerations of Recruiting Temporary Workers

Canada is facing its greatest labour shortage in over 30 years. As a result, employers are bringing foreign workers to Canada to fill the gap, and are facing a spectrum of immigration, employment and tax issues in the process. Lawyers need to be prepared to deal with these multiple areas of jurisdiction.

Moderator Howard Greenberg will join an immigration lawyer, a taxation lawyer and an employment lawyer to discuss the recruitment cycle — from pre-contractual considerations to immigration documentation.

1.3 Practice Management Blitz: 60 Tips in 60 Minutes

This fun and fast-paced session will teach you how to exceed client expectations, better manage your human resources, improve your bottom line and use technology to achieve results more cheaply and more efficiently. Learn how you can more effectively communicate with clients and provide them with more professional service, manage tasks and deadlines with ease, run productive meetings, deal with thorny HR issues, and motivate your staff. As well, panelists will describe software and hardware, gadgets, utilities, the Web, as well as the ethical issues raised by the use of technology.

1.4 Class Actions in Health Care

Until recently, only a few provinces in Canada had legislation governing class action litigation. A Supreme Court of Canada decision allowing class actions to proceed in all

other provinces is creating a significant impact in the civil litigation arena. The number and types of class actions that have been certified in the health care realm are also on the rise. These include litigation against pharmaceutical companies, manufacturers of medical devices, health care professionals and institutions, tobacco manufacturers and governments.

1.5 Pension Reform in Canada: The Impact on Your Practice and Your Clients

Recent developments in pension reform and case law are having a very real impact on employers and employees across Canada. This program will update you on recent developments and unravel some of the mystery and complexity of pension regulation. It will also provide practical insight on how these developments apply to your practice and your clients.

Monday, August 18, 2:00 - 4:00 p.m.

2.1 Winning Advocacy 2008: Appellate Advocacy – Using Your Words

Two experienced litigators will square off in an old fashioned moot before a panel of three appellate judges. The judges will critique the practitioners’ factums and oral presentations, discuss advocacy in general, and describe the distinct features and needs of courts of appeal and appellate-level judges.

2.2 400 years of French language influence and Canada’s hybrid judicial system

To mark 400 years of Quebec’s existence within Canada, the CBA’s Conference of French-Speaking Common Law Members Continuous Legal Education Program will bring us up-to-date on language rights, with a particular emphasis on the rights of official language minorities across Canada, through presentations by renowned speakers from across the country.

2.3 Improving Access to Justice: The Need for Lawyers and the Judiciary to Go Electronic

This session will discuss how technology can improve access to justice in large and small trials. The presenters will use the case of a family law trial to illustrate how counsel can use

technology to improve courtroom performance and help judges have a better command of the evidence when writing a decision. Learn how best to prepare an electronic trial from both the lawyer and client perspectives.

2.4 Speaking Truth to Power

Lawyers who advise the different levels of government share a challenge with in-house corporate counsel — speaking truth to power. Both types of lawyers find themselves in a similar position — their jobs can depend on the favour of the bureaucrats, politicians, CEOs and directors that they report to, yet they often have to report on the shortcomings or failings of these same individuals. This program will examine specific case studies where these challenges have been experienced and in some cases overcome, namely advising governments on the illegality of legislative proposals and the role of corporate counsel in ensuring adherence to securities reporting requirements. Last year's firing of federal prosecutors south of the border, allegedly for political reasons, will also be open for discussion.

2.5 Environmental Law 101 & Recent Trends

The program will provide an overview of environmental law basics and fundamentals.

Tuesday, August 19, 9:00 - 10:30 a.m.

3.1 A Woman's Place is in the House

This program will focus on areas of practice for women lawyers that are sometimes considered non-traditional, including politics, corporations and the judiciary. Panelists will explore why women have been and still are under-represented in these areas, and how women are increasingly making a difference in these "houses" – legislatures, court-houses, and as in-house counsel.

3.2 Criminal Inadmissibility in the Cross Border Context

Find out what every lawyer should know about criminal inadmissibility under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*. Focusing on the effect criminal charges and convictions have on people coming into Canada, panelists will discuss both the effect of Canadian convictions and criminal dispositions, with a particular emphasis on U.S. dispositions and sentences. The panel will also examine the differences in the treatment of permanent residents and visitors to Canada, including the available review process for both.

3.3 Shhh... I've Got a Secret! How to Stop Others from Spilling the Beans

Trade secrets are a form of intellectual property that can sometimes be the best way of protecting a company's intangible assets. However, with more people moving from one company to another, more mergers and acquisitions, and more pressure to seek joint venture or other business relationships, it can be difficult to ensure trade secrets are not used to jump-start the business of a competing entity. The panelists will explore practical ways to prevent trade secrets from leaving the door with departing employees or managers, or as a result of a business deal.

3.4 Cradle to the Grave: Considerations when Starting, Expanding and Winding Up a Law Practice

This session will explore the considerations that have to be made when starting a legal practice. Topics will include whether to incorporate, leasing vs. buying office space and equipment, retirement planning, and closing the practice.

3.5 The Definition of Charity & Gift: Is There a Canadian Standard?

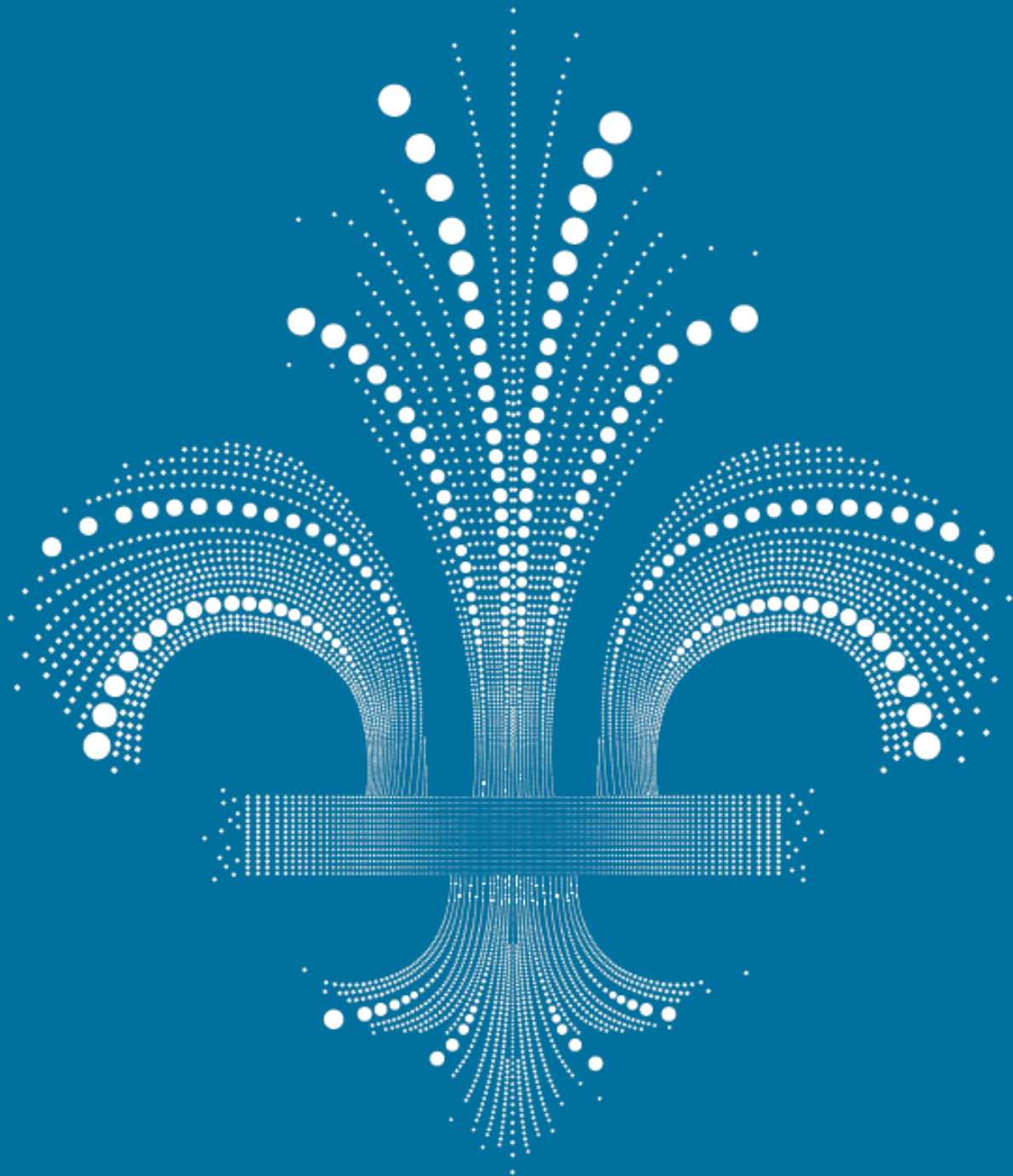
Is there a definition of "gift" in Canada? Is there a difference between the common law and civil law meaning? How does it impact the practice of the charities you advise? Advising a charity and assisting it to prepare a gift acceptance policy may not be as clear as it seems. Join this expert panel for answers to these and other questions surrounding charity and gift acceptance in Canada.

Tuesday, August 19, 11:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

4.1 What is Reasonable Accommodation?

In March 2007, Canada signed (but has yet to ratify) the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, which incorporates the concept of reasonable accommodation. In Quebec, a controversy has flared up about whether forbidding the use of hijabs by women competing in sports events is unreasonably unaccommodating. In *Council of Canadians with Disabilities v. Via Rail 2007 SCC 15*, the Supreme Court of Canada was divided in a 5-4 decision. This panel will address the recent controversies across the broad spectrum of equality grounds.

4.2 Children and the Law

Children are routinely involved in family law litigation - both as the subject of litigation between their parents/guardians and, at times, as litigants in their own right. How do we ensure the best interests of children are protected in litigation? How do we ensure the voices of children are heard? This program will cover matters such as children's representatives or advocates, use of experts, parenting coordinators, among others. Recent case law wherein children have commenced or defended litigation as parties in their own right, will also be discussed.

4.3 The Practice of Law: Negotiation Skills for Lawyers

This presentation will teach you how to prepare for a negotiation, how to pick a strategy, as well as how to employ and how to counter some of the most common negotiation tactics. The session will end with audience participation followed by group critique of the approach used by participants in the demonstration.

4.4 Deal or No Deal: Procurement in the Public Sector

The courts and CITT have been active recently in releasing decisions related to public sector procurement (*Double N Earthmovers v. Edmonton, Toronto Transit Commission v. Gottardo, and Stanco Projects Ltd. v. BC* to name just a few). Given that the public sector is one of the largest procurers of goods and services across all industries, this topic will be of interest to both public and private practitioners. Panelists will discuss an owner's obligations to bidders, bid compliance, "bid shopping" and much more.

Tuesday, August 19, 2:30 - 4:00 p.m.

5.1 Evidence: The Only Constant is Change

The rules of evidence are in a constant state of change. Nuances now exist between advice privilege and litigation privilege. What are the consequences for documents covered by the implied undertaking rule? Have the courts written this into the civil law? Is the rule universal between civil and common law? As technology evolves, we discover new evidentiary issues almost daily. How do we deal with this? Are we Americanizing the law of expert witnesses? What is the latest and where do we stand? Hear the answers to these questions and many more.

5.2 400 Years of the Military in Quebec and Canada (1608–2008)

There is no disputing that wars waged on Canadian soil and those waged abroad by our military have forged the nation's legal and constitutional framework. In this 400th year after the founding of Québec City, our panel will explore the military in Canada, and Québec City as a military fortress.

Eminent military historians Jack Granatstein and Serge Bernier will cover one of these two topics in each of the two official languages. The links between Canada's military history and legal evolution will be at the heart of the discussion.

5.3 How to Make Money in the Electronic Era in the Business of Real Estate

This forward-thinking session will touch on the streamlining of residential real estate, software applications and, most importantly, new marketing techniques for residential real estate lawyers across Canada.

5.4 Insolvency on the Catwalk: A Look at the Model Orders

This panel considers the tenability of model CCAA/receivership orders and the (un)constitutionality of the regulatory process wherein unelected bodies are quasi-legislative or executive. The Office of the Superintendent of Bankruptcy often neglects substantive regulation of commercial insolvency/restructuring, focusing instead on professional licensing/discipline and oversight of personal bankruptcy. Have political and legislative processes failed to keep insolvency law and attendant regulatory regimes current?

5.5 PIPEDA 2.0? An Advance Preview of the New PIPEDA

This program will provide a preview of what the new PIPEDA may look like as the result of the revisions in the Parliamentary Report and Industry Canada's response to the report. Specifically, the program will identify key elements of PIPEDA which are up for revision, trace their evolution through the submissions, the Parliamentary Report and the government response, and then explain the CBA's National Privacy and Access Law Section's proposed approach to the issue.

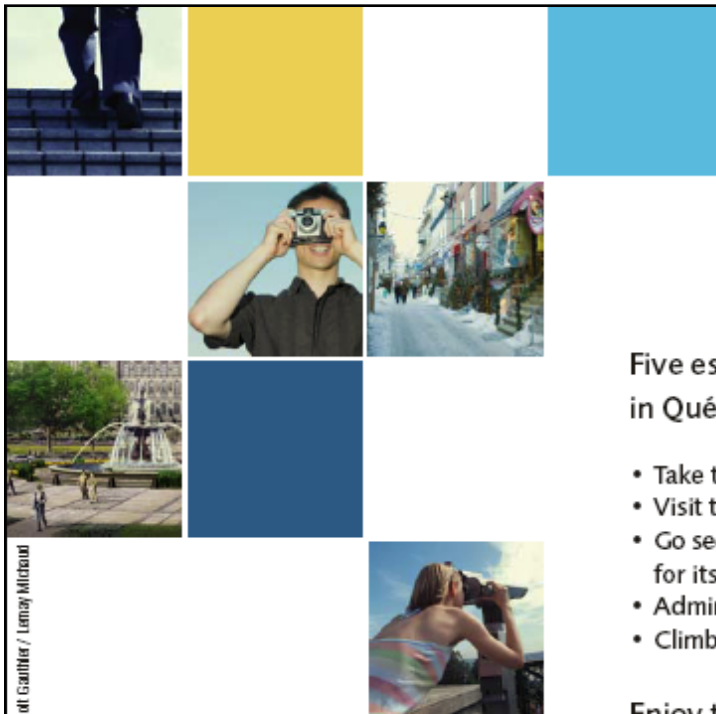

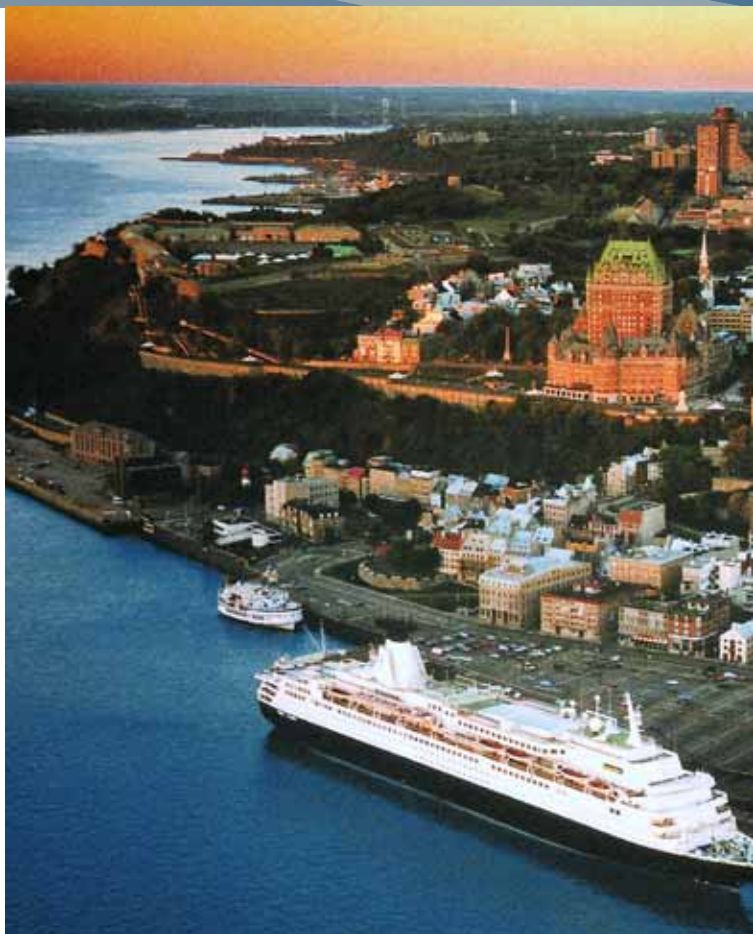

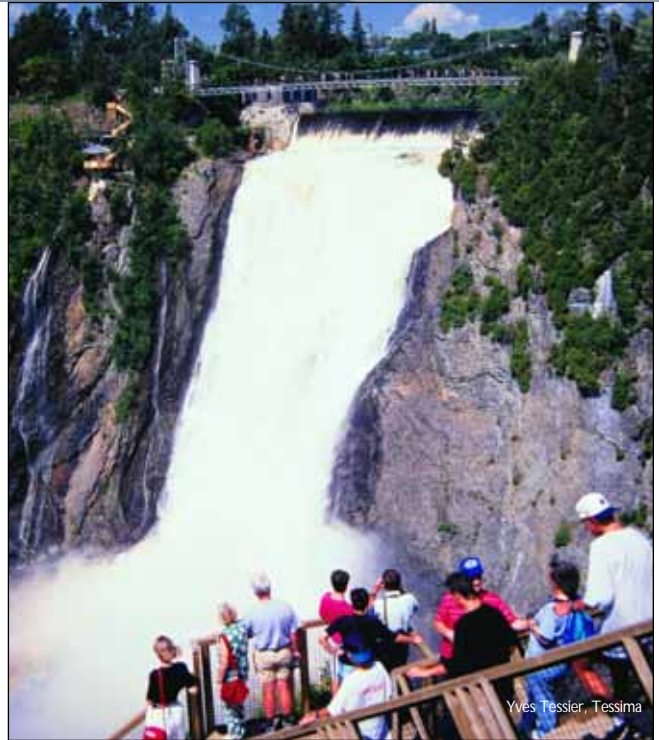
