Description

Quantifying business losses is a complex task. Financial statements contain a wealth of information about the past, if you understand how to use them. Forecasts and valuations can be helpful, if they are prepared using rigorous and objective analysis. Financial experts can play a role, but should be carefully selected.

Chartered Business Valuators (CBVs) are analytical specialists who frequently quantify business losses in the context of litigation. 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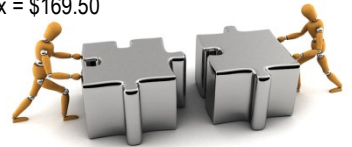
