

## **Professor Marie-Ann Bowden, College of Law, University of Saskatchewan**

Marie-Ann Bowden BA. LLB. LLM. joined the Faculty of Law at U of S in 1981. Her research interests include environmental law, public interest advocacy, water law and property law. She was Chairperson of the Saskatchewan Environmental Assessment Review Commission and was author of its Report. Through the Canadian Environmental Network she sat as a member of the Regulatory Advisory Committee for CEAA for several years. She is co-editor of the *Canadian Journal of Environmental Law & Policy* and co-authored of *Understanding Property: A Guide to Canada's Property Law* with Marjorie Benson. More recently she completed *A Legal Guide to Aboriginal Drinking Water: A Prairie Province Perspective* with co-author Linda Duncan. A Canadian Bar Review article, written with Martin Olszynski, "**New Pieces in the Puzzle? Red Chris and Vanadium and the Future of Federal Environmental Assessment**" is also forthcoming. In February of this year Marie-Ann was invited to appear before the Senate Standing Committee on Aboriginal People to address Bill S-11, *The Safe Drinking Water for First Nations Act*.
